Program 3:

Journey Tour: Museum Visit, History Presentation & Precinct Walk

For a fully immersive and enriching heritage experience, this extended Community Program combines self-guided museum entry, a curated History Slide Show Presentation, and a guided walking tour of the Shepparton Heritage Precinct. Designed for community groups, organisations, and visitors with a strong interest in local history, this program offers a comprehensive exploration of the Greater Shepparton Region’s cultural and historical development.

History Slideshow

The program starts with a curated History Slide Show Presentation. This multimedia session brings Shepparton’s stories to life through historical images, narration, and oral histories. The presentation provides valuable context to the museum displays, highlighting the transformation of the region over time while sharing lesser-known stories, local identities, and significant community milestones. Delivered by knowledgeable Shepparton Heritage Centre volunteers, the session can also be tailored to suit specific group interests, including themes such as migration, education, civic leadership, or local industry.

Self-Guided Museum Experience

Discover the rich history of the Greater Shepparton Region through a self-guided experience of the History Museum, centred around the Heritage Listed Institute Hall — Shepparton’s oldest surviving public building, constructed in 1873.

This engaging museum experience provides visitors with the opportunity to explore a diverse collection of artefacts, photographs, documents, and memorabilia that reflect the social, cultural, and economic development of the region over time.

Guided Walking Tour

The program then continues with a guided walking tour of the Shepparton Heritage Precinct. This outdoor component offers participants the opportunity to engage directly with the physical landscape of the city's history. The walk explores key heritage sites and landmarks surrounding the Centre, including the architectural and historical significance of the Institute Hall, early settlement locations that reflect the foundations of Shepparton's industries, and the riverbank precinct, which played an important role in recreation, transport, and community life.

Along the way, participants will also encounter significant heritage markers and stories, including the Furphy legacy, notable architectural features, and sites that reflect Shepparton's social and economic development. These locations provide a tangible connection to the past, allowing visitors to better understand how the city has evolved over time.

Catering Services

We offer pre-arranged catering services for community organisations and program participants, including tea and coffee, morning or afternoon tea, and light lunches tailored to group size and dietary requirements, providing convenience, comfort, and opportunities for social connection.


Community Connection Program Outcomes

By connecting museum collections with storytelling and real-world locations, participants gain a deeper appreciation of Shepparton's heritage and its continuing influence on the present day.
